1. Title
2. A list of all the authors, their affiliation, and contact information. Presenters must be clearly identified
3. An abstract of 500 words or less.
4. An indication of what concurrent session you would like to contribute to or indicate "Poster." Include preference of presentation type (ie- Powerpoint LCD projector).
5. Indicate if the presenter is a student
