Conference Background

The theme of the 46th Annual Conference of the California-Nevada Chapter of the American Fisheries Society is "Fisheries Science: Learning from the Past to Manage the Future". This year's theme is intended to focus our attention on the successes and failures of fisheries science in order to understand and manage our fisheries for an uncertain future.

This call for papers seeks oral and poster contributions relevant to the conference theme on topics such as the following: Ecosystem Based Fisheries Management, Hatchery Management, Fish Health Assessment, Genetic Fisheries Management, Habitat Restoration, Marine Fish and Fisheries. In addition we seek contributions in general fish biology, life history, and ecological studies relevant to fish and fisheries.

Abstract Submission

Abstracts are due February 1, 2012. Abstract submission must include:

1. Type of presentation preferred (oral or poster).
2. Topic area from above list, or suggest a topic.
3. Title, in upper/lower case type using as few words as possible.
4. Author(s) name(s) as they should appear in the abstract book, full affiliation, and mailing address, and phone, fax, and email address.
5. Name of presenter and contact person if different from first author.
6. Students indicate participation in "best student paper or poster".
7. Text of abstract in 300 words or less.
8. **Important:** Write "Cal-Neva AFS Abstract" in subject line of email.
